Chairman's Update

We are nearly half way through 2024 so it's time to update members on some of the things that have been happening this year and also our plans for the second half. Each year brings new challenges and new opportunities and 2024 has been no different.

One of the saddest things to happen recently has been the death of one of our founder members, Rowan Parker. Rowan had been involved in the original discussions on taking the Cardall



Collection into public ownership back in the mid 2000's. He was a volunteer ever since, together with being a member of the Management Committee and a Trustee. We will miss Rowan's contribution very much and we send our sincerest condolences to his family.

Another major change in 2024 is the Tithe Lodge café reopening. This has been long awaited (over 12 months with one abortive attempt) and we are hoping this time it will be successfully launched and draw in an increasing number of visitors to Tithe Place who in turn will stop by and take a look at our exhibitions and the items we have for sale.

In the last Newsletter I mentioned that Val Brown has joined us as a new volunteer focussing on translating some of our increasingly large number of legal documents relating to buildings and land in Southam. Val is diligently going through these documents deciphering the writing and struggling to make sense of the many abbreviations and legal terminology. If you have any experience of working with old legal texts and could perhaps help, Val would be very interested to hear from you, even if you can only help on an occasional basis.

Having had to discontinue his involvment last year due to health problems Peter Rollins condition has now stabilised and he has agreed to rejoin the Heriatge Collection in a slightly less onerous role as a Trustee. This means we are now have three Trustees – viz Bernard Cadogan, Linda Doyle, and Peter. However we would still welcome some additional Trustees – we hold Trustee meetings no more than twice per year. Spring Exhibition

Throughout the years Southam has always had a thriving set of clubs and associations, some for purely recreational purposes, others to provide services for the people of the town. Today there are at least 40 such groups in place. A large number of

Given the above we thought it appropriate to reflect on what our predecessors from relatively recent times and longer ago have been doing and so we reopened the Exhibition Room in the middle of January with an exhibition focussing on old and new clubs and associations in and around Southam.

With assistance from some of our volunteers and members, we put together an exhibition and TV display with details and photographs from sports

clubs, social associations and children's clubs. The posters are backed up with a large range of photographs from Southam



Ramblers and short articles, with the display cabinets filled with items from the Twinning Association, sports trophies (e.g. the Donkey Derby) and a large and pretty selection of ladies' powder compacts collected by member Chris Holding. The exhibition will run until June 21st.

Roads and Transport in Southam

Our current thinking for the second half of 2024 is for an exhibition focussing on Roads and Transport in Southam. We have a range of maps, photographs, letters and research focussing on this area, which will make an interesting exhibition. However, if you have any items which you think could be useful, we would love to see them.

Warwickshire Arts & Crafts Trail 2024

The annual trail has been going on for many years now, but Southam has had very little participation,

that is until this Summer. It is on from June 22nd until July 7th over 3 weekends and 2 weeks. This falls between our Spring and Summer Exhibitions, so we are going to experiment with joining Southam First's Arts and Crafts Trail, by using our Heritage Collection Exhibition Room as part of the

trail, alongside St James Church, the Congregational Church, Galanos House and the Solas Home shop by the Bowling Green. Each venue has a selection of different artists and crafts, of which a Trail Leaflet will be available nearer the time with names of artists, their crafts and when the venue will be open.



Our Exhibition room will feature 2 artists, a jeweller, a glass artist and a book binder, alongside our Timeline Posters and publications. So do call in and take a look at something different. A free brochure (shown above) is available in Tithe Place.

Talks

Linda and Bernard are getting back into the swing of doing PowerPoint history talks for local organisations. Linda has started off with doing several talks on Dr Henry Lilley Smith and on Southam workhouse after the latest books published, and is now preparing one on Saint Wulfstan initially for Long Itchington WI, but it will be available for other groups.

Linda and Gerry are doing some Show & Tell talks for small local groups for a lower talk fee as Southam Lions have kindly covered the cost of being able to do these for small groups who would otherwise not be financially able to cover their costs to include speakers. We did one at Galanos with a wide range of old Southam photos and recently did one for the Vision Support Group where they could handle clothes and items. These small groups are social, and essential for getting elderly and disabled persons out and about, so thanks to the Lions, we have been able to do something for several different small groups on a regular basis now.

Our website page has been updated and a leaflet is available to make it easy to book for such organisations if you know of any.

Long Itchington History Group

We do not have a history group in Southam as it is difficult to find suitable places and time for us to do history talks. However, Long Itchington is on our doorstep and any Heritage Collection members are invited to join them as a visitor to their History Group meetings, which are held in the Community Room at the school on the 2nd Wednesday evening each month. Just turn up for 7.30 pm. Talk details are posted on our notice board in the Exhibition Room each month with the next one being on Sept 11th after the Summer break.

Students

We have had a lovely young lad from Southam College doing his Duke of Edinburgh Award with us on Saturday mornings. Vinnie has an interest in history and a special interest in hats, of which he has many, including historical ones. So, he organised a children's Easter Bonnet Parade during the Easter holidays and his mother very kindly provided us with some small Easter eggs for visiting children to find as well. He enjoyed himself and so did the visiting children.

We have also had a student from Stratford College doing photography and living in Fenny Compton, use his work experience time to take photographs of Southam from positions they were taken in early 1900, so we have some comparison photographs.

Tombola and Raffles

Thank you to everyone who provided us with items for our tombola and raffles that we frequently do. These are all providing us with items to create excellent tombola in particular - we had a very successful event at the Lions May Fair on Monday May 6th at the Bowling Green and although we did not raise millions of pounds, every little helps.

Thank you also to those who regularly buy and donate second hand history books (documentary or fiction) with us, and donate small antique items for us to sell from the Exhibition Room.

These all help to raise the annual rent/service charge, because we do not get any assistance from the Government or grants and next year we have a rent review.

Heritage Open Days

Once again we will be providing history town walks for HODs. These will be done at 10 am, 11 am and 12 noon on Friday September 6th and September 13th, to coincide with St James Church opening their doors with refreshments those Friday mornings. There is no need to book unless there is a group of you, and if those Fridays don't suit you, Linda can always take a pre-booked group of 5+ at 11 am on Sundays September 8th or 15th.

In addition, in conjunction with the Mayor, Cllr Angela John, we hope to be doing a special Town Walk for local civic leaders in early September.
